



40 Hour Basic Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) Class

The Missouri Crime Prevention Association is proud to present a **40-hour Basic Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) Class**. This is a POST Certified, 40-hour training session. The course will be held **August 10, 2009 to August 14, 2009, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. daily**. The training will be conducted at the **Cape Girardeau Police Department Training Room, 40 S. Sprigg Street, Cape Girardeau, Missouri 63703**.

The conceptual thrust of the CPTED program is that the proper design and effective use of the physical environment can produce behavioral effects that will reduce the incidence and fear of crime, thereby improving the quality of community life. These behavioral effects can be accomplished by reducing the potential of the physical environment to support criminal behavior.

Law enforcement officers, architects, subdivision developers, city/town planners, mayors, private security personnel, crime prevention practitioners and building maintenance supervisors are encouraged to attend.

Topics to be covered include Crime Causation, Natural Access Control, Natural Surveillance as a Crime Reduction Technique, Territorial Reinforcement, Crime Prevention Classifications, Residential/Business Community Design, Approach to Facility Design, and Five Types of Information Needed for Proper CPTED Planning and Field Assignments.

Instructional objectives for major course segments:

CPTED Concepts and Principles:

This session introduces the CPTED concept, six core principles, and additional environmental factors to consider. After completion of this segment, participants will be acquainted with the CPTED Concept, the six core principles and associated factors encountered when conducting CPTED assessments. Lecture is supported by photographic examples of poor and ideal conditions for each of the principles in a variety of settings.

Wayfinding Signage and Landscaping:

This three-part session will examine the benefits, design and use of a comprehensive wayfinding system and two key wayfinding components: signage and landscaping. After completion of this segment, participants will be familiar with terms and attributes of wayfinding, signage and landscape systems as they apply to CPTED practitioners.

Small Scale Exercise

The small scale table top exercise will provide participants with a practical means to apply information from the previous segments to a site specific problem. Participants will be provided with written and photographic examples (PowerPoint) before engaging in group problem solving discussions.

Travel Routes – Traffic Calming

Participants will be introduced to geographic and system approaches for defining problems associated with travel routes (vehicular/pedestrian) and parking facilities. Example strategies for traffic calming and resolution of common problems will be discussed.

Special Applications

This segment expands the basic CPTED applications to specialized areas. Included in the sessions will be photographic examples and discussion of CPTED as applied in urban environments, schools and universities, industrial settings, parks and greenways. Additional areas may be included as needed to meet individual participant's interests.

Lighting Applications

This session provides an overview of lighting concepts and terms used in a variety of CPTED applications. After completion, participants will be familiar with the four basic types of lighting applications, five common lighting systems and common lighting conflicts found during CPTED assessments. A nighttime lighting field exercise will reinforce and enhance upon the classroom discussions.

Large Scale Exercise

The large scale table top exercise will provide participants with a practical means to apply information from all previous segments to a multi-site problem. Participants will be provided with written and photographic examples (PowerPoint) before engaging in group problem solving discussions.

Community Planning and CPTED

This session provides an overview of community planning concepts, processes and documents. Participants will be exposed to planning terms and how planning units may incorporate CPTED principles and strategies into planning activities and policies.

Site Plans and Blueprints Overview

This session will allow participants to become acquainted with the typical elements of site plans and blueprints.

Data Collection and Data Analysis

This session covers the minimal data elements to be evaluated for a comprehensive CPTED Assessment. Participants will be exposed to qualitative and quantitative data examples, how data is typically collected and problems when conducting analysis for presentations.

Conducting CPTED Assessments

This session will provide participants with typical methods of conducting CPTED assessments. Discussions will cover team makeup, roles and responsibilities, checklists and report writing.

Field Exercise

This session provides participants with the opportunity to apply classroom instruction to a physical setting. Participants, working in assigned teams will be required to collect data, conduct a field assessment and prepare a 20 minute report (PowerPoint) for presentation. The report will be critiqued by the instructor and class participants.

Next Steps

This session provides participants with the opportunity to participate in a guided discussion of how they may apply the course materials to their job or jurisdiction.
